	<p>SPPS will follow protocol for notifying the Local Health Department of confirmed Covid 19 cases among students and staff and clusters of any illness among staff or students. Logs will be maintained for staff and student screening and for cohorts for contact tracing purposes, and a plan for timely cooperation with LPHA is in place. SPPS will work with our LPHA to determine possible classroom or school closures or quarantines and will support education of students when quarantine is necessary.</p> <p>Marion County Health & Human Services Phone: (503) 588-5357 24/7 Disease Reporting (503) 588-5621</p> <p>SPPS students have been placed into smaller cohorts of 24 or less students to ensure physical distancing guidelines can be followed, and will track these stable cohorts with daily logs. 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COVID-19 vaccinations to educators, other staff, and students if eligible	All eligible SPPS are fully vaccinated and their cards are on file at the office. Mitigation strategies are put into place for staff with religious or medical exceptions.
Universal and correct wearing of face coverings	All SPPS students (K-8) and staff wear masks inside the building, unless spaced appropriately for eating/drinking. Mask breaks are allowed as necessary with proper distancing in place. Students are not required to wear masks outside in accordance with the RSSL guidance.
Physical distancing and cohorting	All student desks are spaced six feet apart. Students remain with their cohort (class) throughout the day - inside and outside of the building. Students are encouraged to give one another space inside and outside of the building. Cohort logs are maintained by classroom teachers and the office.
Ventilation and air flow	Classroom windows are kept open throughout the day. Each classroom has a medical grade HEPA air purifier that is appropriate to the classroom square footage.
Handwashing and respiratory etiquette	Students have received instruction about proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette from their classroom teachers and are encouraged to wash their hands throughout the day. Hand sanitizer is also available in each classroom and outside the classroom doors to be easily accessible.
Free, onsite Covid diagnostic testing	Covid testing is available onsite with BinaxNow rapid tests for students/staff who have been exposed or who are displaying symptoms while on site.
Covid-19 screening testing	SPPS has signed up to partner with the state in providing Covid-19 home screening options for students and staff who would like to opt in to the program.
Public Health Communication	SPPS staff, parents, and students will be notified by phone or email in a timely manner of any possible Covid-19 exposure. SPPS will work with our local public health agency (Marion County Public Health) to determine course of action and quarantine periods for those affected.

(OAR 333-019-0010)</p>	<p>SPPS administers a screening questionnaire to all parents each morning via email (DocuSign) to identify those who have been exposed to Covid-19 or who are having symptoms. The results of daily questionnaires help to identify those who are required to be excluded from school. All students who have been exposed or who display symptoms must be excluded from school for appropriate length of time as determined by the LPHA.</p>

All school policies, protocols, and procedures center on equity in accordance with the Catholic social justice teachings of the Catholic Church and religion standards provided by the Archdiocese of Portland.

To remain in compliance with ARP ESSER requirements, school districts must regularly, but no less frequently than every six months (taking into consideration the timing of significant changes to CDC guidance on reopening schools), review, and as appropriate, revise its Safe Return to InPerson Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan.
